Specific revisions to the titles listed below include the following:

- Elimination of questions with the “I, II, or III” answer choice format. These questions have been rewritten or, where appropriate, replaced entirely.
- Greatly reduced emphasis on identification of the literary devices/figurative language. Instead, revised questions focus on the purpose or effect of an author’s use of specific literary and stylistic elements.
- Minimal use of question stems specifying “Not,” “Least,” or “Except.”
- Heightened focus on the author’s purpose and how he or she uses language to achieve that purpose.
